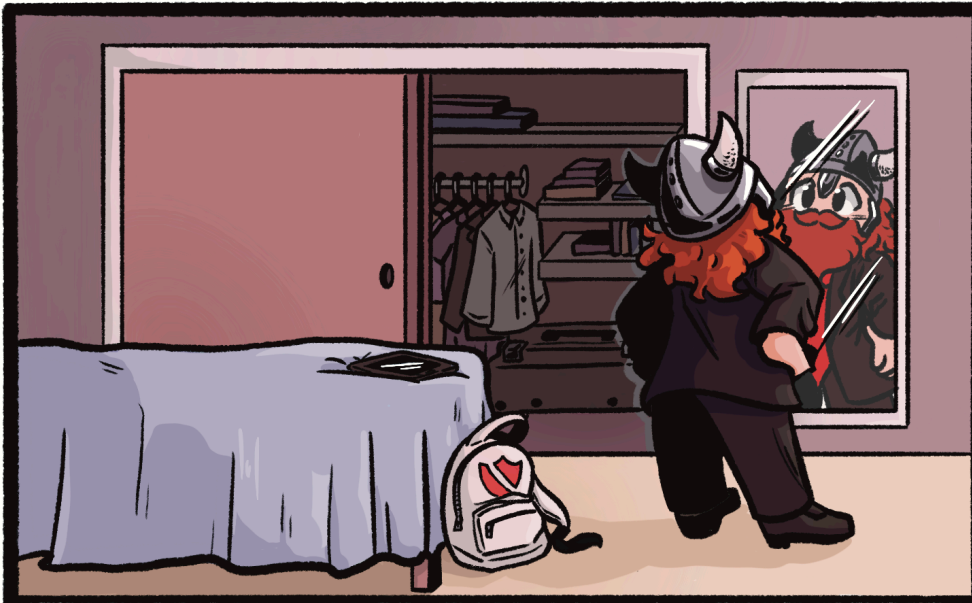


Maya Connell '21 (Any pronouns)

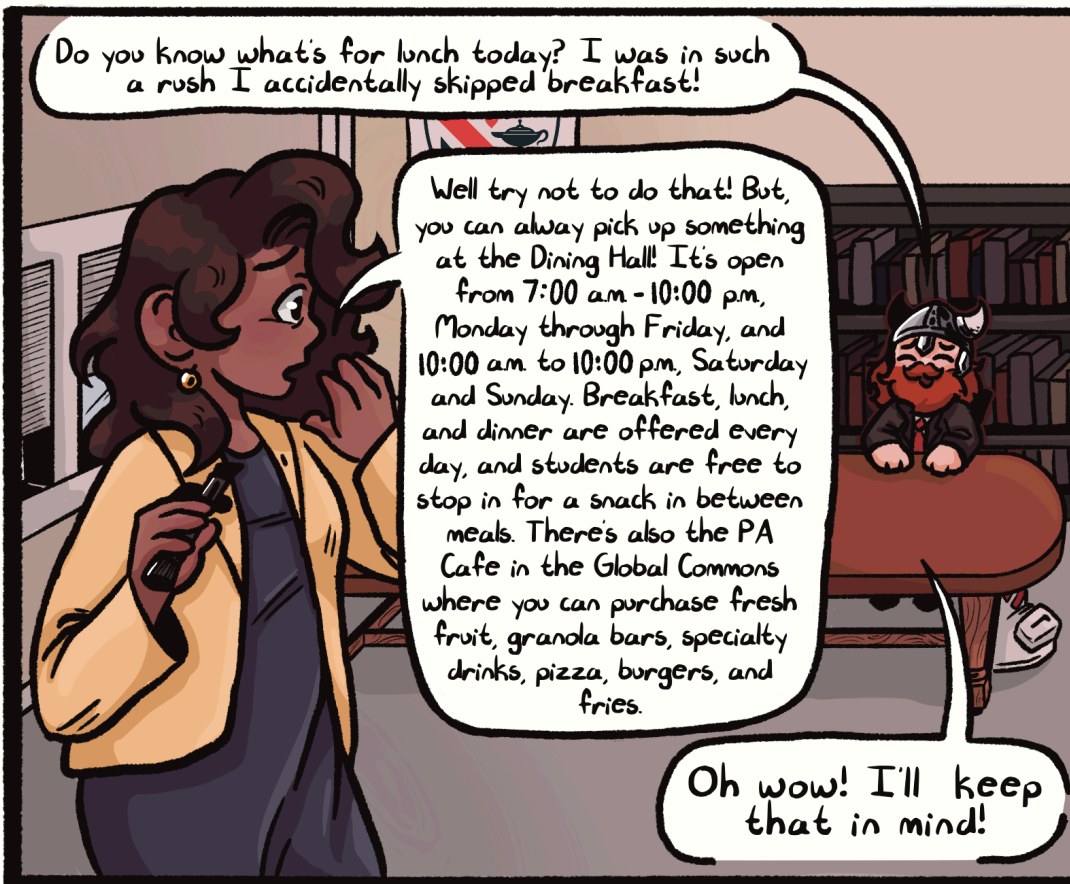
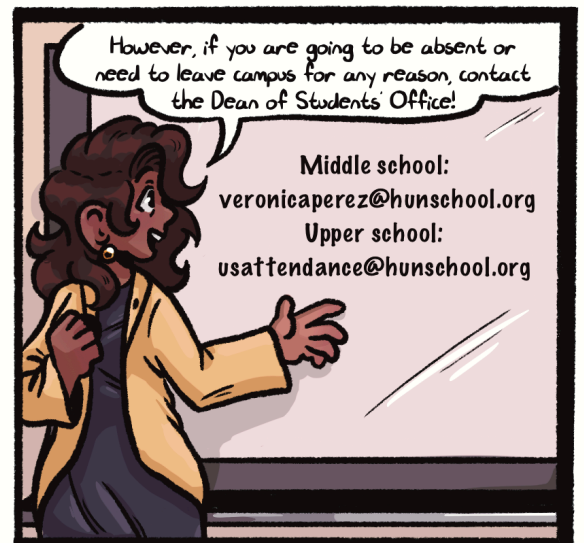

Participation is one of the most important things to do in class. Try to participate everyday!

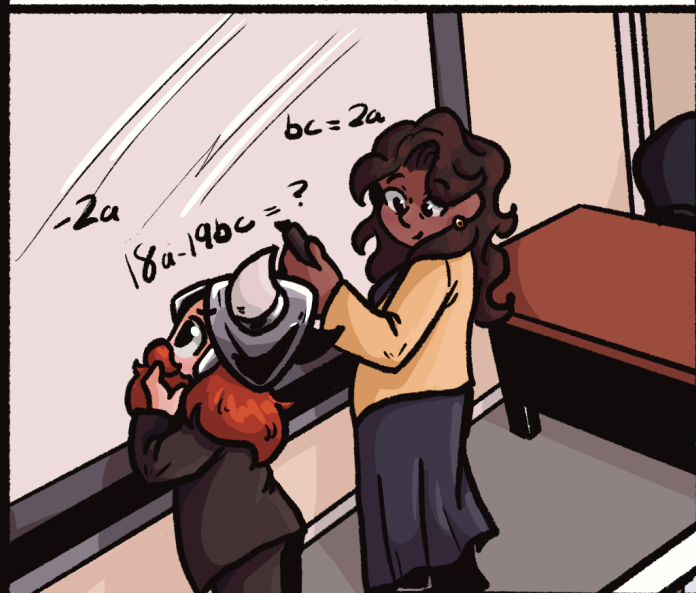
If you don't know something, feel free to ask! Hun classes are lively and you are encouraged to speak up.

Peer Tutoring is available in the library and Media Center Monday-Thursday, 3:30-4:30 p.m. and again for boarders in the evening, 7:45-9:45 p.m.



For more regular support, students can contact the Academic Learning Center or sign up for Resident Coaching in the evening. For students who need designated study time, Study Support, a formal study hall, is offered during the day.

You'll learn how to navigate RaiderNet at orientation (you too parents!) This is where you find class syllabi, assignments, and grades.



It's also an easy way to contact your teachers. You will have about thirty minutes of homework, per class, each night.

One of the best things about Hun is that Hun students say they feel safe trying new things. Sometimes it's tough to show up at an event when you haven't met many people yet. But, take a leap and go! Attending events or trying a new club or activity are some of the best ways to meet kids with common interests!



The Club fair is a great place to start looking for places to participate if you aren't sure what's right for you! (Clubs, Athletics, and Performing Arts count toward the five required Participation Points students must accrue each year!)

This is for Student Government! It's one of the many leadership opportunities for Hun students.

Well one of the best ways to become a campus leader is actually to apply to join a Leadership Cohort. The programs are application based and take place in the evening once or twice a month, for two years. Graduates of this program learn more about themselves, different leadership styles and how to mentor others.

Many go on to earn leadership roles in various areas of school life: extracurricular activities, peer leaders, proctors, student government, discipline and honor committees, and national honor society.

Then you should meet with your grade level dean or advisor!



Your grade level dean can help you with any academic scheduling. The deans know all about opportunities at Hun and help guide students toward their academic goals. Speaking of academics, I've heard of the Hun Scholars Program, do you know what that is?

Sure! The Hun Scholars Program allows Students to identify interdisciplinary interests and then select courses and independent projects that inform and support that study. They'll create a portfolio of projects, earn honors designation in those courses, and receive a Scholars Distinction on their Hun School Diploma.
